Important Guidelines

Dear Volunteers,

Thank you for the time you are planning to give toward making the Fisherman's Festival Fundraiser 2010 the most successful one to date! Without your help we could not support our special non-profit organizations.

We are asking for your cooperation regarding the following:

NO TRADING OF FOOD, OR ANY TYPE OF BEVERAGE!

No food, beer, or sodas are to be given out without a ticket. In order to properly calculate our profit and loss we must keep track of each ticket.

DO NOT BRING ANY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES INTO THE FESTIVAL:

All alcoholic beverages consumed must be from the on-site sales of beer and wine. According to our ABC License no one is to bring any alcoholic beverages onto the Festival grounds, to violate this rule could cause us to lose our license. Beer tickets are available for all volunteers over 21 from your chairperson.

VOLUNTEERS WORKING FOOD BOOTHS:

We recommend all volunteers tie their hair back, or wear a cap while working with food. There will be a separate sheet of guidelines sent out to all food volunteers.

VOLUNTEER FOOD:

Please eat before you come on your shift, or after your shift. No eating while working! **Volunteers must work a minimum of four hours to obtain a meal ticket worth \$5.** No volunteer will be served food out the back doors between 11AM and 2PM. This is our busiest time for the paying public and all the plates need to go out the front to keep the lines to a minimum. This means all volunteers; if they must have food during those times will also need to stand in line. Any volunteer who wishes to pay for their own food will further enhance our fundraising abilities... and we thank you!

PARKING:

Parking is very scarce. Please try to car pool, or come early. The only cars that will be allowed on site are those needed to supply the food booths and these must have the proper permit on their dashboard.
